

Searching State Standards

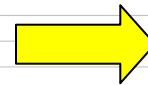
- Select the desired state to search from the “State” drop-down. (Florida has been set at the default in Preferences, but may be changed manually by using the drop-down box.)
- Select document type from the “Document Type” drop-down.
 - Includes Access Point
 - Next Generation State Standards (Common Core)
 - Next Generation Sunshine State Standards
 - Special Diploma PO’s and Alternative Assessment Standards
 - Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Standards
 - Common Core State Standards
- Select the standard to apply from the “Standards Set” drop-down.
- Choose a range of specific grade levels from the “Grades” drop-downs.
- Click “Search.”
- A link to matching titles is returned, as illustrated below.
